



Starting preschool and school

Preschool

Preschool is an important early step on your child's journey through education, giving them the chance to play, learn, grow and develop.

There will soon be a change to when children start preschool. These changes will be gradually introduced in 2013.

From 2014, South Australia will have the same first day of preschool for all children. This will be the first day of term one.

The same first day of preschool will mean that every child will have four terms of preschool and then four terms of reception when they go to school.

It will also mean a more stable environment for children with fewer changes to groups throughout the year.

If your child has already started preschool and you move, your child can start as soon as they are enrolled.

	from 1 May to 31 December	Term 1 2016

When can my child start preschool?

There will be no change in 2012.

In 2013 preschools will continue to enrol children in term one and term two.

From 2014, if your child turns four before 1 May, they will start preschool on the first day of term one.

If your child turns four on or after 1 May, they will start preschool on the first day of term one the following year.

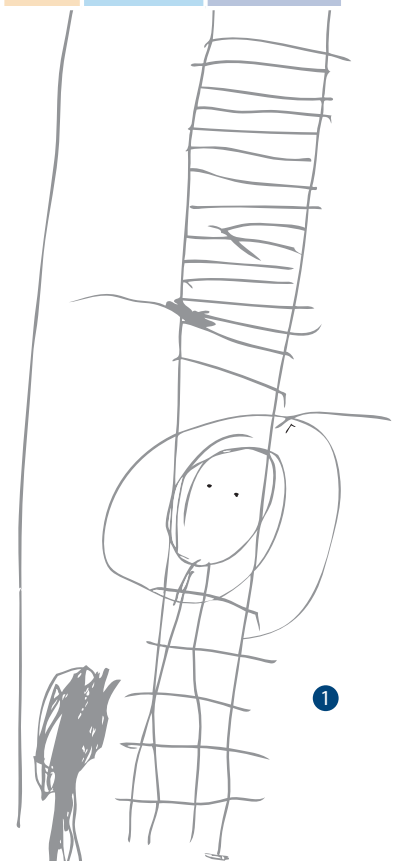
The minimum age for starting preschool will then be three years and eight months.

What happens if my child has additional needs?

Children with additional needs* may start preschool early. This will be decided on an individual basis.

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Starting school

Starting school is an exciting time for families and children as our youngest citizens take early steps on their journey through education and on to the rest of their lives.

There will soon be a change to when children start school.

From 2014, South Australia will have the same first day of school for all children. This will be the first day of term one.

Having the same first day of school means that every child is guaranteed four terms of reception before they go on to the rest of their primary schooling.

It will also mean a more stable environment for children with fewer changes to classes throughout the year.

When can my child start school?

There will be no change to what happens now until 2014.

From 2014 the start date will be the first day of term one.

If your child turns five before 1 May, they will start school on the first day of term one in that year.

If your child turns five on or after 1 May, they will start school on the first day of term one the following year.

The minimum age for starting school will be four years and eight months from 2014.
